Mission

To proclaim the everlasting gospel to every nation, kindred, tongue, and people by establishing local Adventist congregations in all people and language groups where presently there are none, and in new geographical areas.

Strategy

1. Identify people groups (nationality, language, religion, culture, etc.)
2. Determine which groups do not have an Adventist presence.
3. Prioritise these unentered groups and develop strategies to reach them and start new groups of believers.

What is Adventist Mission?

Global Mission: Starting new Seventh-day Adventist congregations among unreached people groups.

Mission Awareness: To raise among church members an awareness of the Seventh-day Adventist Church's worldwide mission program, and how it is directly supported by mission offerings and tithes.

Key Goal: Reach unreached people and increase awareness of mission amongst local members.

What is Global Mission?

Through the pioneer program, Global Mission operates with a wholistic approach, reflecting what Ellen White referred to as Christ's method: Mingling with people, Showing sympathy, Ministering to needs, Winning confidence, Then and only then: Inviting to follow Jesus

Global Mission recognizes...

- Church is not a building—the church is people.
- New congregations should reflect the local culture, while holding true to the unchanging principles of God's Word.
- The need to multiply into many new congregations.

History of the "church"

As the church spread throughout Europe and Asia they sometimes worshipped with the Jews in Synagogues but were then thrown out of them.

From that time on the only mention of churches were in the new testament, in houses:

- Romans 16:5 - Paul sends a letter to Priscilla and Aquila having church in their house. "Greet also the church that meets at their house..."
- 1 Corinthians 16:19 - "The churches in the province of Asia send you greetings. Aquila and Priscilla greet you warmly in the Lord, and so does the church that meets at their house."

- Colossians 4:15 – “Give my greetings to the brothers and sisters at Laodicea, and to Nympha and the church in her house.”
- Philemon 2 – “also to Apphia our sister and Archippus our fellow soldier—and to the church that meets in your home:”

There were no church buildings built for the first few hundred years in the early church. Church buildings came into existence through the same man who helped change the Sabbath from Saturday to Sunday, Constantine (early 300s).

This creates a new opportunity... to be like the early church.

Unreached People Group

A group among which there is no indigenous community of believing Adventists with adequate numbers and resources to effectively witness to that group without assistance from “outside” (e.g. foreign cultures or other people groups).

Priority Groups

The Mission Priority System is designed to guide you toward Global Mission priority groups to receive higher amounts of funding. When choosing your project focus group, look for the red priority colour for the categories of language, people, and religious background. If you can put global mission pioneers (church planters) into those people groups, the General Conference will fund a higher percentage of the project.

Harder to reach = more \$\$

Mission Priority System

Process:

Review: Mission > Union > Division > General Conference

- Can be returned at any stage for changes

Funding: General Conference > Division > Union > Mission

- All levels of the church are required to participate in funding Global Mission projects.
- Contribution can include housing, or a food garden, etc.

Global Mission Pioneers

Lay members or Bible workers trained to plant new congregations in unentered areas.

- Must be sent in teams of at least two – solo placements face discouragement and lack accountability.
- Projects that do not include at least two pioneers working together will receive little or no funding.
- Minimum 3 weeks initial training, with specific content for the cultural and people group they are entering.
- Training support can be enhanced by inviting experienced church planters or religious experts at low or no cost to the local field.
- Mentoring plans must be in place before placement.
- The Adventist Mission Director at the local Mission or Conference is responsible for oversight.

Goal: plant a new group within 3–5 years (may take longer with difficult groups).

- 3 years = Christian group
- 5 years = Non-Christian group

Pioneer Benefits/Allowances

- A written agreement is required, including:
 - Employment status (often not as an employee/worker but a volunteer)
 - Place of work (specific area)
 - Term (starting and ending date as pioneer)
 - Salary (amount and mode of payment)
 - Training (specify next training period)
 - Periodic reports (at intervals determined by the initiating organization)
 - Pioneers should receive a living wage, “equal to at least 80% of a local pastor’s salary.”
*Must be justified if below 65%
 - Past underpayment led to low-quality workers—this standard seeks to improve retention and effectiveness.
 - Can’t be pastors – will not fund a pastor’s wage!

Project Criteria

- Use of Funds:
 - No capital expenditures (buildings, vans, trailers, etc.)
 - Only for people and resources directly involved in planting.
- Funding Recall Triggers:
 - Project not started within 6 months.
 - No report 12 months after funding.
 - Always report!!! Even if nothing changed – write that!
 - Project changed without GC approval.
 - Misrepresentation or misuse of funds.
- Reporting Requirements:
 - Reports due 10–12 months after project approval, and annually.
 - Late or missing reports may result in funding suspension or recall.
 - If delays occur, a progress report and explanation must be submitted by the Division.

Global Mission Centers

The purpose of the Global Mission Centers is to equip Seventh-day Adventists to establish new groups of believers among non-Christian people groups.

They help the church build more effective bridges to people from Muslim, Jewish, Buddhist, Hindu, urban, secular and post-Christian backgrounds:

- Global Center for Adventist-Muslim Relations

1. Create project: Project plan is entered into the system.
2. Review plan: Each organisation reviews the project plan.
3. Commit funding: Each organisation commits a portion of the funding, with the General Conference committing first and the local field committing last.
4. Vote project: After funding is confirmed, each organization votes the project and records it in the system.
5. Transfer funds: Funds are transferred and recorded in the system.
6. Report: 10-12 months later reports are due in the system.
